5 TIME TO DEFINE

1 COLOUR YOUR WORLD

Playing with colours and patterns is one way to make a statement. A yellow armchair, burgundy sofa and a playful patterned rug ensure this room's pizzazz.

2 SEE WHAT'S IN STORE

Displaying books and keepsakes in glass-fronted cabinets helps keeps them safe yet visible, and—bonus—reduces how often you need to dust them.

3 WONDER WALL

This fun rustic wood panelling is a nod to the classic groovy '70s walls you may remember, and placed horizontally, these ones widen the appearance of the room.

4 ON THE TABLE

A modern gold frame on the coffee table adds a pleasing hit of glam, and its circular design plays well with all the softer elements in the space.

5 GREEN MACHINE

The greenery plays a huge part in the overall aesthetic here, and can be considered the star of the show. Strategically placed near windows, the botanicals truly bring the outdoors in.

6 HIGH FIVE

Eclectic pieces like the handshaped chair are what make this room stand out. This chair's vibrant red shade complements the other bold pieces in the room.

1 LINE UP

Delicate line drawing artwork is tasteful and minimal, and here, it keeps the look cohesive throughout.

2 SIMPLE STORAGE

A spot for holding books and decor is essential, even in a spare design. This open style option with potted plants placed on top adds height to the scheme, leveling off at the top of the artwork beside it. This makes the room feel grounded and is necessary in a space with such a high ceiling.

3 TEAL FEEL

A teal ottoman and stool are the splash of vibrant colour that makes this space pop. Placed separately, they pull the look together.

4 SITTING PRETTY

A light grey couch with chaise longue extension is the perfect addition to this open space. Here, it creates separation from other areas of the house. A couple of black toss cushions call to the whimsical design on the rug below, and add some sophistication, to boot.

5 IN THE CLEAR

A clear glass coffee table keeps sightlines open for an elegant barely-there aesthetic. We love its simple crossed panel design.

6 HIGH DEF

A large rug does wonders for defining a room in an open-concept space. This one's pattern calls to the line drawing on the wall and black accents throughout, including the light fixtures up top.
